What does 4-H offer volunteers?

Curriculum, Resources, & Agent Support

Work with the 4-H agent to develop ideas, obtain curriculum, plan meetings, and market programs.

Leader Training

Volunteer trainings are held at the county level for adult and teen leaders.

Certification Workshops

Shooting Sports, Livestock, & Horse program volunteers must attend certification workshop to become certified. Volunteers are given training and materials needed for teaching these disciplines.

Kentucky 4-H Volunteer Forum

Every two years, volunteers may attend the Kentucky 4-H Volunteer Forum in Lexington. Fun workshops and awards banquets make this a great weekend.

Volunteers must complete an application process and be approved to become adult and teen leaders.

Teen Boards & Councils

High school youth may participate in area teen council, state teen council, and state leadership boards in their area of interest while developing leadership skills.

Area Teen Council

Teens can serve as representatives on the Purchase Area Teen Council and assist in planning teen trips and events.

State Teen Council

Teens may apply to serve on the State Teen Council and assist in planning and implementing events like Teen Conference and Teen Summit.

Performing Arts Troupe

Youth in high school that enjoy singing, dancing, and playing instruments can try out for this awesome opportunity to practice and perform with this group at statelevel 4-H events.

Shooting Sports Ambassadors

Teens who have completed Shooting Sports Coach certification workshops may apply to serve. Ambassadors market shooting sports programs and help with state-level events.

Fashion Leadership Board

Teens interested in fashion, sewing, and needlework may apply to serve on this board. Members teach workshops and promote 4-H fashion programming.

Camps and Conferences

4-H Camp

Every year, 4-H'ers attend a four day, three night camp at West Kentucky 4-H Camp in Dawson Springs. Campers can canoe, cook, fish, dance, ride horses, participate in archery and ropes courses, and much more! (Ages 9-14)

4-H Teen Conference

Teen Conference is an opportunity for high school youth to spend a week in June at the University of Kentucky participating in workshops, learning leadership skills, and making new friends. (Grades 9-12)

4-H Issues Conference

Issues Conference is a great experience for high school-aged youth to learn about identifying and addressing community issues. When participants return from the conference, they can apply for a \$500 grant to implement a needed program in their community. (Grades 9-12)

4-H Teen Summit

Teen Summit is a middle school leadership conference held at the Lake Cumberland 4-H Leadership Center in March. Youth play group games and participate in fun workshops. (Grades 6-8)

Regional Teen Opportunities

Youth can participate in Teen Retreat (grades 8-12) and Stuck in the Middle (grades 6-8) at West Kentucky 4-H Camp each year, in addition to Winter and Summer Teen Trips, day camps, and more!
