State Meeting -

Registrations are arriving daily for the KEHA State Meeting May 7-9, 2024, at Sloan Convention Center and Holiday Inn University Plaza in Bowling Green. Visit the State Meeting webpage for information on registering,

making room reservations, and other details. The following are a few important highlights to note.

* Session Registration

- Registration for sessions and crafts is first-come, first-served, so make sure you sign up early!

- Discounted early-bird rates are available until April 9, which is also the deadline for ordering a T-shirt. Late registration must be postmarked by April 23 at the latest.

- One session is already full. Please check the fillable PDF registration form on the State Meeting page before registering. The form will be updated regularly as classes fill. Refunds of the class fee will be issued after State Meeting for anyone whose payment was received after a class reaches capacity.

- KEHA is once again utilizing a full conference or two-day registration pricing structure. Please know that it takes great expense to reserve the amount of meeting space and equipment re quired to host all that KEHA State Meeting offers. Registration is critical to cover those costs.

* Overnight Rooms

- The KEHA group block rate at the Holiday Inn is \$126/night (1-2 people; scaled pricing for more people per room). This rate is available until April 6 or until the block is full. If you have reserved rooms you no longer need, please cancel those before April 6 so others can take advantage of the reduced group rate.

- Overflow hotel rooms are now available at Hilton Garden Inn across the street from the Holiday Inn and Convention Center. Information on the rate and a link for reservations is on the State Meeting website. Reservations must be made by April 19 to secure the special rate.

* Other Meeting Notes

- Raising Hope will provide free health screenings Tuesday 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and Wednesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.! Fasting may be recommended for more accurate results but is not required. Look for more information on location and in your program.

- Agenda highlights include the opening luncheon at 11:30 a.m. Tuesday, the business meeting at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, the general session featuring the choir at 5 p.m. Wednesday, and the awards luncheon at 11:30 a.m. Thursday. All times are Central time.

- <u>Silent Auction</u>: Each county is encouraged to bring an item for the silent auction. Proceeds will benefit the 4-H Foundation.

- <u>Raffle Basket</u>: Each area is asked to provide a themed gift basket for the State Meeting raffle. Proceeds from the raffle will benefit the Ovarian Cancer Research and Screening Program. As always, thank you for your generosity and help in providing these items for the conference!

- <u>Ouilt Square Auction and Showcase</u>: Members are invited to make a 12-inch finished quilt square for entry. Details are available in the KEHA State Newsletter. Proceeds will help offset the costs associated with KEHA State Meeting.

- \Rightarrow May 15 990N Deadline for 501(c)(3) organizations with fiscal year ending Dec. 31.





The University of Kentucky's Sanders-Brown Center on Aging was established in 1979. The worldclass center hosts a wide variety of laboratories and scientists dedicated to research, education, and outreach. It also provides clinical opportunities for people to learn more about and advance research in healthy brain aging and age-related neurodegenerative disorders, including Alzheimer's disease and related dementia.

In 1985, Sanders-Brown became one the original 10 Alzheimer's disease research centers federally supported by the National Institute

on Aging. Today the UK Alzheimer's Disease Research Center (UK ADRC) is one of the nation's leading centers on aging. In addition to its focus on the pathologic transition from brain health to cognitive impairment, the UK ADRC also provides clinical and neuropathological diagnoses, care of patients with cognitive impairment, and offers clinical trials so researchers can better understand disease processes and test new therapies. Scientists at the ADRC are often seeking volunteers to help them find ways to slow, prevent, and someday, cure Alzheimer's disease and related dementias.

Director Linda J. Van Eldik has served as director of Sanders-Brown since 2010. She was recently honored with an appointment to the National Advisory Council on Aging to work with notable leaders and researchers in the field. During her fouryear term, Dr. Van Eldik is helping advise the director of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the director of the National Institutes of Health, and the director of the National Institute on Aging. In Kentucky and across the country, Dr. Van Eldik helps champion aging research and initiatives that encourage the health and overall well-being of aging adults. In addition to Dr. Van Eldik's leadership, several Sanders-Brown Center on Aging researchers serve on national boards including the Alzheimer's Association and Alzheimer's Foundation of America, guiding the direction of future treatments.





April. Savor the Flavor: Seasoning with Spices – Mike Keller

Individuals preparing meals at home are more likely to meet the daily recommendations for fruits, vegetables, and whole grains. However, individuals share they find it difficult to add flavor while keeping their meals healthy. This lesson encourages participants to use spices to add flavor and make nutritious meals more exciting. The lesson goal is to increase knowledge about various types of spices and how to incorporate them into food preparation and cooking

May. Strong Bones for Life: Prevent Osteoporosis – Anna Morgan

Keeping bones healthy and strong is important throughout the lifespan. Without proper nutrition, exercise, and even sunshine, the risk for osteoporosis increases. Osteoporosis is a bone disease that causes bones to become weak and more susceptible to breaks. This KEHA lesson will examine risk factors and lifestyle behaviors to help stop bone loss and rebuild bone to prevent breaks. It is never too early or too late to make bone health a priority.
